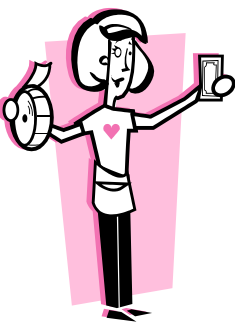
- ⇒ full size toiletries (no alcohol base or sample sizes) or tissues
