Apply for a scholarship today!

Scholarships are available for students who want to attend a private school or for homeschool expenses for grades K-8.

Your child may qualify for up to 75% of tuition or a maximum of \$1,500 at the school of your choice based on your family's annual household income.

Scholarship payments are made directly to the school on behalf of your family as long as you remain eligible.

Yearly 600 students are receiving scholarships through Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund to attend a private school or for homeschool expenses. Eligibility of families is based on predetermined income requirements.

Families who meet the eligibility requirements and reside in one of the participating counties*, can expose their children to a rich diversity of people, new ideas and different ways of learning.

Getting Started on the Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund Application Process

Do you qualify for an NOSF scholarship?

There are several requirements that must be met to qualify for tuition assistance:

- Must be a resident in *Allen, Crawford, Defiance, Erie, Fulton, Hancock, Henry, Huron, Lucas, Ottawa, Paulding, Putnam, Richland, Sandusky, Seneca, Van Wert, Williams, Wood or Wyandot Counties*
- Children must be entering into the **K-8 grade** for the 2018-2019 school year
- Income and household size must meet requirements (see below)

Income Eligibility for the 2018-2019 School Year

Find your income on this chart, and note the percentage of tuition for which you qualify, according to your household size (includes children and adults in house). The maximum scholarship amount is \$1,500. Please remember that each family must pay at least \$500 towards tuition.
