St. Aloysius Catholic School Registration Procedure

Preschool Registration: Preschool registration begins in January for our currently registered families. At our Open House, registration opens for all families on a first come first serve basis. A commitment form and a \$100 registration fee is required to secure your child's placement in the class.

Kindergarten Readiness/Kindergarten Registration and Placement: Registration for students in Kindergarten and Kindergarten Readiness will begin in March for all families. A completed registration packet and the Registration/Materials Fee are to be returned by March 15, 2019. Upon receipt of a Kindergarten student's registration, the student will be placed in the class of the parent's choice. After screening in August 2019, a recommendation of placement into the Kindergarten Readiness or Kindergarten class will be decided by the Kindergarten Team (principal & teachers). If the educational team placement does not match the parent's initial registration request, further discussion will be initiated with the parents to determine what the best educational course is for the student.

Grade 1-8 Registration: Registration for students in first through eighth grade will begin in March for all families. A completed registration packet and the Registration/Materials Fee are to be returned by March 15, 2019. Admission to St. Aloysius Catholic School for new students will be determined by the Principal after reviewing previous school records. If after discussion with parents, admission is denied, the fees will be refunded.

St. Aloysius Catholic School requires a solid commitment from parents to register and enroll their child(ren) for the 2019-2020 school year no later than June 1, 2019. Various factors influence the school budget – enrollment, economy, state funding, parish subsidy, etc. In order to give the school appropriate time to study these factors and to budget effectively, we ask parents make a final enrollment decision before summer break of 2019. Classes will be filled in the order in which the Registration packet and Registration/Materials Fee are returned. If the packet and/or fees are returned after the class is full, the student will be placed on a waiting list and payment will not be processed until a space becomes available.

Grant or Scholarship Opportunities

There are different scholarship opportunities available. Please apply for the scholarship/grant that applies to your family. The criteria for each are listed below.

Parishioner Grant (not available for Preschool):

This grant of \$2,100 is available to families that meet the following criteria:

- The family has at least one family member in the home who is Catholic and is registered with St. Aloysius Parish or a parish in the diocese that does not have a school.
- Through the use of time, talent and treasure the family helps support their parish.
- The family attends Mass.

Multi-student Grant:

Families with multiple children in our school may apply for the multi-student grant- the value increases for each additional child attending St. Aloysius. See application for detail.

Ed Choice Expansion Scholarship:

This is a state of Ohio scholarship open to families whose total household income is 200% above the poverty line. Students must be entering grades KR-5. For the 2019-2020 school year the scholarship amount is \$4,650. If a family believes they may qualify, please request a registration packet for details.

Ed Choice Traditional Scholarship:

This is a state of Ohio scholarship open to students assigned to designated underperforming public schools. Kenwood Elementary School in Bowling Green is currently listed as eligible for Ed Choice. Students who attend Kenwood for the current school year (or would be eligible to enter there as a kindergartener for the 2019-2020 school year) may qualify for this scholarship in the amount of \$4,650.

Jon Peterson Scholarship:

This is a state of Ohio scholarship open to students on an IEP. This scholarship will pay for services for the students and in some cases will pay for tuition. Please contact the school office for more information. If your child is on an IEP, please contact the school office.

Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund:

This is an independent scholarship opportunity. The pre-application deadline is April 26, 2019. Applicants must meet financial requirements and be drawn through a lottery to be awarded. If a family believes they may qualify, please refer to the flyer included for more information. The application is completed online

Financial Aid:

Please contact the school principal if your family does not qualify for the above scholarships and there is a need for financial assistance. We will do our best to find a source of scholarship funds for your family. It is our goal to make a Catholic education available for all families who choose it for their children. Parish assistance amounts will be adjusted if other scholarships are later awarded.

SCRIP Program:

All families are also encouraged to participate in our Scrip program. Scrip helps families reduce the cost of tuition by purchasing gift certificates for retail establishments. Information on this program is available through the school office or Parent Association. If you and other family members participate, you have the potential to earn your child's entire tuition cost by buying gift certificates for purchases you already plan to make.
